Share The Plate, January 7

This week's STP recipient is the **Unitarian Universalist Association Disaster Relief Fund**. It allows the UUA to respond flexibly to current disaster needs and new emergency situations as they arise. It is part of a covenant between the UUA and congregations, between congregations who give generously and those in need, and with our community partners.

The UUA Disaster Relief Fund disburses grants to UU congregations and recognized UU non-profit entities to help them recover from the impact of tragedies such as hurricanes, wildfires, human caused disasters such as water contamination, and the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2022, funds went to UU churches in the Philippines following typhoons, Bowling Green Kentucky after tornados, and Port Charlotte Florida after Hurricane Ian. Funds are used to repair damage to congregations' buildings, member's and friend's homes, and local partner organizations. They also help with relocation expenses. OLLI Class by Friend of UU

"Stories of Adoption: Then and Now" is being offered at OLLI by Jamie Scott. Thursdays, Jan. 25 – Feb. 15 Four sessions • 3 - 5 p.m. \$60 (See p. 18 of the OLLI Spring 2024 catalog.)

The class is told from Jamie's experience as an "unwed mother" in 1967. In addition to the public, she thinks this 4-part course is relevant to therapists/counselors, adopted persons, adoptive parents, first parents, and people born through assisted reproduction or who have experienced a non-parental event (NPE).

From 1945 to 1973, up to 4 million mothers surrendered their children for adoption. Who were they and why did they relinquish their children? This class explores these questions and more, using documentary film as an anchor for discussion.
