## **Share The Plate, February 18**

This week's Share the Plate recipient is The Warming Shelter. Located in Wilmington at Grace United Methodist Church, it opens on extremely cold consecutive nights to offer emergency, overnight beds and comfort to persons experiencing homelessness. Cots, blankets, hot meals, and care items are provided. Hosts offer a non-judgement zone of safety to cultivate an environment of relaxation and peace.

With only 24-48 hours' notice to mobilize, the shelter is organized and hosted by several United Methodist pastors and a dedicated community of volunteers. During the cold snap in January, it was open for six days and hosted 140 guests on the coldest night.

Our financial donation could cover the costs of one night at The Warming Shelter, which exceeds \$550. Financial donations also fund two other initiatives: a downtown drop-in day center open two weekday mornings and mobile shower, washer, and dryer trailers. ## **Guardian ad Litem Program Open House**

The Guardian ad Litem Program is hosting an Open House for community members to learn more about volunteering as a child advocate. The event will take place in our offices at 320 Chestnut (6<sup>th</sup> Floor) on Thursday, February 29 (drop in between 4:30 and 6:30) and Friday, March 1 (drop in between 11 and 1).

Our volunteers are screened and trained to represent the best interests of children involved in the court process due to experiencing neglect or abuse. There are approximately 150 GAL volunteers representing over 350 children in New Hanover and Pender Counties, but more volunteers are needed.
