## **Share The Plate, February 25**

Share the Plate this week goes to The Harrelson Center.

For many people in our area, living under the threat of financial and emotional crisis is an everyday reality. Where do you turn when your life has turned upside down?

Fortunately, you can turn to The Harrelson Center. Housed in a former jail, The Harrelson Center is the home to 22 nonprofit partners that provide centralized humanitarian services to the Wilmington community.

At the heart of the Harrelson Center is the Help Hub, a one-stop resource that exists to help folks in crisis avoid eviction, maintain utility connections, and afford vital medications. Because of its location, the Hub can also quickly connect people to one or more of the non-profits in the building. Access to healthy food, clothes, job

skills, emotional support are just a few of the resources available, at no cost. And, in addition to the convenience of all these agencies under one roof, the Harrelson Center provides the financial support and structures to help these agencies not just survive but thrive in this challenging economy. In place of competition between agencies, the Harrelson Center promotes an atmosphere of collaboration, mutual respect, and support. The essence of community.

All the non-profits share a commitment to provide needed services and resources to improve the lives of those in need, providing every individual with hope, dignity, and a sense of self-worth.

As one staff member observed, "People can come here because it is not only <u>in</u> the heart of Wilmington but because it IS the heart of Wilmington."

As it's been said many times, this former jail "was once a place of incarceration. Now it's a place of transformation."

### <u>Call to Action - Ask Your State Elected Officials to Sign-On to the Leandro</u> Candidate Commitment Form

UUCWNC is taking a bus of UUs and partners to the Leandro Plan Rally in Raleigh on Thursday, but if you can't go in person, you can still make a difference:

- **1.** Call and/or Email Your State Representative and Senator (Find their Contact Info here <a href="https://ncleg.gov/FindYourLegislators">https://ncleg.gov/FindYourLegislators</a>)
- **2. Talking Points** (Feel free to use your own words, but urge them to sign the Leandro Candidate Commitment Form; link below):

"My name is \_\_\_\_\_\_, and I am a person of faith and one of your constituents. Today, people across North Carolina have traveled to Raleigh for the State Supreme Court's oral arguments in the Leandro School Funding Case. Despite the landmark victory for public school funding in 2022, a change in the political make-up of the courts has prompted an unprecedented and unjust rehearing of the case. I join them in demanding that our children finally receive the sound, basic education promised to them in our state's constitution through full finding of the Leandro Plan. I am asking you as an elected official and candidate in the 2024 elections to sign on to Every Child NC's Candidate Commitment to Leandro. By signing you would be indicating that you are aware of the current failure to provide every child

in the state with access to a sound basic education, and pledge to vote to implement the spending and policy recommendations contained in the Leandro Action Plans that have been submitted to the Courts.
