Share The Plate, March 31

Unfortunately, over 500 overdoses occurred in New Hanover County last year. Fortunately, help is available from Coastal Horizons, this week's Share the Plate recipient. They provide comprehensive behavioral health services for individuals and families across our community. Annually, they serve over 15,000 people with many programs to address various mental health and substance abuse challenges. Clients say, "Coastal Horizons is a "change your life" program. I was treated with respect. This program has put me and my family back together."

New initiatives include:

- embedding a therapist in the hospital emergency department to triage youth and facilitate connections to vital community support programs such as Family Centered Treatment, Child First, and outpatient counseling
- assisting more than 1000 individuals in accessing Medicaid benefits since the 12/1/23 Medicaid expansion in NC
- deploying Clairigent, an AI suicide assessment tool, at various school-based sites including Wilmington Health Access for Teens

Answers to Your Financial Questions

How do I check my donation history?

All members of UUCWNC have access to our secure, digital member database. You can see your own donations, and only yours, when you select your household. Click on View Donations towards the bottom right. (Remember that we operate on a fiscal year, so the donation year 2024 refers to July 2023 – June 2024.) If you are a member and are having trouble accessing the database, please let Holly know so you can receive a new invitation to reset your password.

Where does my check in the Sunday collection plate go?

Any check with a blank memo line is credited towards your pledge if you are a pledging member, or to general UUCWNC collections if you are not. Checks designated in the memo as Share the Plate (STP) are split: half the amount is sent to our Share the Plate recipient; half is sent to general UUCWNC collections, which supports our operating expenses.
